Its predecessor, *The Palestine Post*, was founded in 1932 by Gershon Agron. The name change occurred in 1950. Formerly regarded as left-wing, the paper underwent a noticeable shift to the right in the late 1980s. From 2004, under then editor-in-chief David Horowitz, the paper took a more centrist position.
